







"Francisco is 14 years old, diagnosed with Autism and blindness. When Francisco first started riding, he made unsafe choices for his horse and himself. Our team, joined with his compassionate and committed mentor and volunteers, put our heads together to figure out how to help Francisco, and we realized **he needed a challenge.**



He needed to be pushed to problem-solve how to accomplish tasks, which would then give him more confidence and courage. So we paired Francisco with **calm and collected Moe**. For a young man like this who is craving a challenge and learning how to make positive choices that lead to success, a horse that is going to remain calm regardless of any chaos that comes helps create an environment that is safe and predictable.

The first challenge was to put a halter on Moe with no assistance. After that he learned how to lead Moe independently by using his neck as a guide and listening to our voices. Once this was accomplished, he re-entered the group lesson in the arena. He even began to groom and tack his horse independently. Independently! If it weren't for Moe's patient and reliable spirit, Francisco may never have been able to gain the courage and confidence that enabled him to grow in ways no one ever dreamed possible."




Domino joined Agape 8/14/2015 / Laid to rest 5/16/2019

We like to think of all of our therapy horses as gentle giants, but Domino truly was giant. A black Percheron gelding, standing 16.2 hands tall and weighing nearly 1800 pounds, he was huge. His size was like a magnet for people. But more than his magnetism, there was his enormous heart. He was gentle, patient, still, and kind. He could stand for hours being groomed. He could carry anyone steadily through their lessons. He could go round after round at our horse show, The Mane Event, helping riders showcase their skills for family and friends. But the thing he loved the most was pulling a carriage.

Each year Domino would spend at least one week at our South site for summer camp, helping campers that could not ride for one reason or another. They would ride along in our carriage, side-by-side with a driving instructor, often taking the reins and getting to experience the thrill of driving. And Domino would stand even taller; his eyes would gleam and he would step forward with eagerness. Campers would grin as the carriage rolled into action and they all set off down the lane.

Domino served at all three sites and helped hundreds of individuals experience the joy that only a horse can bring us. Early in 2019, he developed a serious health issue in his neck, and on May 16 the Agape team made the decision to humanely euthanize him due to the pain this condition was causing him. After his passing, Domino was honored at all three sites with memorials, stories, pictures, laughter, tears, and love.

Domino, thank you for your years of service! You truly were a gentle giant in every way.
