













RIDER Impact Story

Tim has been a rider at Agape for over 20 years and has ridden at all of Agape's sites, most recently Agape's East site in Greenfield. With multiple diagnoses including Autism, Mild Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy, Epilepsy, Vision Impairment, and amongst others, Tim has faced many challenges in his 35 years. With his mom, Angie, by his side they have found a second family and a place that Tim can shine!

His mother shared that because of horses, Tim is calmer and uses softer communication after being with the horses, he has a tendency to use a loud voice. His focus has also improved, which is a huge success for him. His confidence has grown significantly and his oppositional defiant behaviors have not once happened while at Agape. Tim works hard physically and mentaly while following directions from his instructor. The friendships that he has developed have been very important and he asks about everyone at the barn when he is away.

Tim loves every aspect of Agape, even scooping poop. He loves to help! One evening after class, because of his joy for scooping poop, the other 3 riders in his class wanted to do the same. It was a great moment to see others following Tim's example.

"My journey at the Agape Therapeutic Riding Center began January 8, 2020 when I walked into the barn for volunteer training. My business coach had put me up to a challenge for 2020. What was the one thing I wanted to do and one fear I wanted to overcome. Being in contribution to others and overcoming my fear of horses is where we landed. And so it began...

Little Foot was the first horse I met that night. It was the first time in many years I was even close to a horse after a scary encounter as a child with a horse. I went through training and signed up to be a side walker. Needless to say I was more than nervous and yet very excited to become a part of Agape and all that they do. I knew nothing about working with horses and the staff at Agape immediately worked with me to educate, guide and encourage me along the way. They are AMAZING! Their understanding of horses and "the Agape way" of working with them shows a true dedication and passion for these wonderful animals and the participants they serve at Agape.

As a side walker, working with a horse handler and a participant, I witnessed first hand the miracles that happen in the arena. When you put a child who has certain challenges in life with a horse that has been gifted the "job" of carrying these wonderful kids so much is discovered. My first experience was with a child that had limited verbal communication but became "alive" when she was on her horse.



The very first night we were paired together she recognized the horse had the same color of hair as I do...blonde. She patted Butterbean and then patted my head and spoke the name 'Buttterrrbean'. While not totally clear, it was VERY clear she knew Butterbean and I shared something in common. As I have experienced a variety of participants working with the horses, and developing so many life skills, I truly felt blessed to be a part of Agape, almost selfish in fact. Was I giving as much as I felt I was learning?

AND THEN COVID HIT March of 2020. Things began to shut down, staff had to be let go and the fundraising was being affected dramatically. Watching the staff scramble through an unknown environment made my husband, Jeff, and I want to help in any way we could. Due to the drop off in staff and limited volunteers we started cleaning the lots on Saturdays. Some would say cleaning up



horse poop isn't exactly the most glamourous, or fun thing to do, but it gave me time to learn to be closer to the horses and it truly was therapeutic.

I have since been a student in a Volunteer riding lesson, learning how to groom and tack a horse to prepare them for their rider and class. In the short time I have been at Agape I have learned what it means to partner with a horse, respect them and their contribution and am enjoying my time even more at the barn.

And then there is March 1, 2021. A MONUMENTAL day for me. For the first time in 51 years I sat on my first horse. Buzz has become my BEST friend and I couldn't have done it without Caroline's AMAZING patience, help and support. To say I was nervous is an understatement and Buzz felt that but being the true "professional" he is he was as patient with me as Caroline. I got off Buzz almost in tears for the accomplishment I felt Agape had provided me and so many others. Just a horseback ride...oh no, there is so much more this program does and I only wish everyone could come experience the miracles this wonderful organization provides....AND IN THE MIDDLE OF A PANDEMIC!

What started out as me just wanting to give back and get over my fear of horses has turned into a passion for these horses, the people at Agape and the work that they do to serve so many. The results can truly be seen and felt while at the barn!"

Impact Story

Sheridan Middle School has been fortunate enough to have funding to bring students to Agape; we have always been so grateful. This year stands out though because of COVID and all we've had to endure because of it.

In the past coming to Agape was a treat. It was something extra and fun while still providing a valuable learning experience. This year it has been an absolute necessity for our students to be able to come. With the stresses our students are facing daily at home and school they have needed Agape. When I ask them what they like most about going, the first thing they say is "I immediately feel calmer when I get there ". Parents tell me that having Agape in our schedule has helped get their kids excited about going to school again.

Our school works very hard to teach the kids about SEL, social emotional learning. We have wonderful programs and a caring staff, but none of that can do what Agape has done for the social emotional wellbeing of my students during this pandemic. They say they feel calmer, have less anxiety, and feel safe at our sessions.





I look forward to a continued relationship with Agape. Students benefit no matter what when coming here, but getting to come "to horses" has been exactly what the students have needed this year.

These are words that describe the 10 horses we said goodbye to in 2020. Some of those horses had been with us for several years; others had only served a short time. What connects them all are the three qualities above.

Their names were Littlefoot, Rosie, Dusty, Patch, Daisy, TC, Buddy, River, Butterbean, and Carson. Each was so loved here at Agape, and each did so much for their people. Littlefoot, Rosie, and Butterbean brought smiles, joy, and independence to countless numbers in their combined 39 years of service. River and Dusty were two ponies with personalities about twice as big as they were. Patch and Daisy were the Paint Horse Dynamic Duo once they came together at East. Many students fell in love with them after just one session together. Buddy had a personality to match his name and befriended anyone that needed a little boost in their life.

Each therapy horse served Agape in a unique way that truly embodied our mission of Unbridled Hope. We were sad to say goodbye to them, but most went on to happy retirement homes where they continue to bring joy and fulfillment to their families. To our four that have departed our company forever--Littlefoot, Rosie, Butterbean, and Carson--we can't thank you enough for dedicating your whole hearts to the Agape Family.





THANK YOU FOR DONATING in 2020!

At the beginning of March 2020, it became obvious that Covid-19 would be here sometime soon. Staff at Agape found themselves planning quickly for the worst--shutting down classes--and by the end of March we rolled out a pandemic action plan. Part of this plan, incredibly, involved sending 18 of our 34 horses to temporary homes with our volunteers. It was nothing short of a miracle for Agape. Volunteers opening their homes to one, two, and even three of our horses, taking on their expenses, providing the daily care they needed, and keeping in touch with the Equine Director for ongoing support. What's more, they did this with very little notice. Some took our horses within days of being contacted. Within a week and a half of contacting volunteers, all 18 horses were placed in their temporary homes and had all that they needed to enjoy an extended spring vacation.

In total, our volunteers helped Agape save more than \$60,000 in horse care expenses. During a time of great uncertainty, this was a huge blessing to us. While Agape offered to cover expenses for our horses needs, many volunteers took on this expense themselves. This included feed, farrier, and minor vet care. The generous gifts from our volunteers housing horses was truly a game changer during the pandemic. We'd like to honor those who were able to house, care for, or contribute to coverage of care for our Agape herd in 2020.
