LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

One of the things I love most about the work of Agape is that each day brings the opportunity for service and leadership. Throughout 2021, we continued to navigate through a pandemic while offering unparalleled services with exemplary leadership.

Together with a team of highly skilled staff, engaged Board of Directors, and dedicated volunteers, Agape served 1,369 individuals through 6,928 lessons. We raised a record-breaking \$882,634 in donations, grants and sponsorships. These efforts afforded us the opportunity to continue to invest in our Greenfield location by constructing a covering over the outdoor arena, providing financial aid to 13% of our riders, caring for our herd of horses, and serving community partners such as Dayspring Center, Lawrence & Warren Township Schools, The Landing, and Brooke's Place.

Though 2021 was a year to continue being nimble while addressing unique needs, Agape was blessed to continue its consistent and impactful work in the areas of helping individuals with disabilities and at-risk youth unlock their potential, build connection and trust with their favorite horse, learn greater communication skills, and find hope at the barn and beyond. And as most know, none of this work would be possible without the over 200 weekly volunteers serving with open hearts and 24 horses providing strength and healing.

With great love and appreciation, we can't thank you enough for every minute of your time and every dollar donated. You made a real difference in 2021 as we celebrated 35 years of service and leadership!












Different special needs diagnoses served in 2021

WE OUR Paisley's Hory

"After graduating from occupational therapy using hippotherapy just before COVID began in 2020, we knew our daughter, Paisley, needed to be back with horses as everything began to reopen. Extreme prematurity has left her with severe anxiety, and we have found that connecting with the horses has been powerful for her. We found Agape East in the spring of 2021. While it is a far drive, we love the country setting and the ability for her to explore nature while she connects with the horse. What we did not expect was the connection she would also have with the humans.

"Our daughter is terrified of men; it is one of her anxiety triggers. When we showed up for lessons one afternoon and she saw 'Tim' next to her name, she immediately wanted to go home. We encouraged her to try it and that she might enjoy having Tim as her side-walker. Convinced this was going to be the worst lesson ever, she agreed to at least go groom her horse. I watched as Tim stood several feet away, with no eye contact or interaction from our daughter. Then when it was time to ride, Tim was made to stand in the middle of the arena far away from her or her horse while other volunteers helped her.

"This process went on week after week. Tim would show up. Paisley would show up. There would be little interaction, but Tim stayed consistent and, as time passed, our daughter began to give eye contact and a few words each lesson. By fall, Tim and Paisley were singing songs on trail rides and interacting with each other each week.

"We love Agape not just because of the opportunity to connect with incredible horses, but the opportunity to connect with incredible people. Through their assignment to the same horse, Paisley had to overcome her struggles and learn how to work within her anxiety so that she could do something she loves. This is such an incredible life lesson as she grows and learns how to live with her anxiety, but still function and enjoy life!"

WE OUR VOLUNTEERS: Story

Steve's Agape journey began about 5 years ago. "I knew about the place and had stopped by it before I started volunteering. I grew up on a farm but had never experienced working with horses. I thought it would be fun, and it is close by, so I took a chance.

"I have been involved with several volunteer opportunities during my time at Agape, from mowing, to moving hay, cleaning lots, and even fixing some things that ended up broken. But the best experience of all is getting to make a difference in the lives of the riders you work with. Every week we see the impact coming to class makes for them. The most memorable class for me was getting to work with a rider who had been riding for a while but was new to the class. I asked her if she was ready to trot. She stated, 'Yes, but we would need to get another handler to help.' I asked why we needed another handler's help and she replied, 'Because you're too old to trot.' I laughed so hard and still, to this day, when I think back on this moment it brings a smile to my face. When I look at my time here, and as I think about the people I have seen come and go over the years, the one thing that sticks out to me about my time here is that this is a WONDERFUL place filled with good people and horses. And if you stick around long enough, you might just find your niche!"

"Six years ago, I moved to Johnson County to be closer to my children and grandchildren. After one year of leaving my friends and being in new surroundings, I needed something to connect me with others. That is when I heard about Agape and the work they do with horses and children—two of my favorite things. When I entered the barn the first time, the smell, noise, and petting the horses all brought me into the comfort zone I had been looking for.

"When asked 'What is Agape?' I would say it is magic. The way a class begins and the way it ends are vastly different. Sometimes riders start out shy, scared, nervous, slow to trust, do not want to get on the horse, and are just plain unhappy. This is when Team Agape shines. The instructors do their magic, side-walkers and horse handlers do what they have been taught, and the wonderful horses do what they have been trained and asked to do for their riders. That scared and nervous rider is changed into a confident, happy, and comfortable rider who is not ready to quit riding. When he gets off the horse, he hugs it and kisses it goodbye until next week. This is the stuff that makes me proud to be part of Team Agape for the last five years."

Buzz and Bo, two older geldings that had become good friends over the years, were ready for retirement. While we were all sad to say goodbye, we were happy to recall their stories and send them off to a much-deserved retirement.

Buzz returned to his previous owner and is living in southern Indiana. Bo went to live with an Agape volunteer and has been a joy to his new family.


These two geldings were steady, kind horses that could do any job we asked of them. They served in numerous summer camps, riding lessons, school groups, trail rides, and hippotherapy. They truly helped to carry out the Agape Way, facilitating personal growth in everyone they encountered daily.

Buzz came to Agape in April 2017 on a short-term lease to serve in summer camp. His steady and kind nature, and his size, made him an ideal horse for camp. We found he was so patient and willing in his work that we asked to extend his lease another year, and later received a grant that allowed us to make Agape his permanent home. In all that time, Buzz remained a sweet, loving, go-to horse. He always had the special ability to give others confidence and help them achieve their goals. One such individual is our volunteer, Amy Corey. Amy volunteered in classes and around the barn. In 2020 she had the

opportunity to participate in volunteer riding lessons. She partnered with Buzz, and thanks to him, she achieved things she was not sure were possible. "I got off Buzz almost in tears for the accomplishment I felt Agape had provided me and so many others. Just a horseback ride...oh no, there is so much more this program does and I only wish everyone could come experience the miracles this wonderful organization provides."

Bo's story is similar. He came to Agape in July 2016 when his owner leased him to our program. He was dependable and unshakeable in any situation. Everyone loved his bright, spotted coat! During his time at Agape, Bo served some of our highest-need riders. One such rider, Dan, looked forward to his time with Bo every week. As a young man Dan was involved in an accident that left him with a severe traumatic brain injury. His sister said coming to see Bo was the highlight of Dan's week and the outing he looked forward to most. Dan found motivation to get active and gain strength at home so that he could come ride Bo. Best of all, Bo and Dan shared a secret language-Dan loved to go fast, and Bo could always tell just the right moment to step into a smooth, slow trot that would bring a beaming smile to Dan's face.

Bo and Buzz, we cannot thank you enough for your service. We hope you are living just as large in retirement as you did in service at Agape!
